Contract information:

This is an unpaid position for an internship open to students who are looking to expand their experience in project development and coordination work within a maritime context. There shall be no expectation of contract change or renewal at the end of this assignment. This post is only offered to candidates who have full legal eligibility to live and work in the UK.

In order to apply for this position, the university in which the student is enrolled must have a pre-existing mandatory or elective option for practical experience as part of its degree requirements. The student is personally responsible for obtaining the necessary visa. No living or travel expenses will be paid by the Organization.

Purpose of the Post:

The overall objective of this assignment is to support the work of TCID in the development of a user-friendly database linked with several internal tools and SAP modules for internal visibility. Specifically in research, the organization and collation of information and data, analysis, and the interpretation of results. The work will involve working with data, databases, and drafting reports. The work will also involve working with a number of colleagues in a multicultural environment.

Required competencies:

- a) Thoroughness and excellent attention to detail in all responsibilities, ensuring consistency in delivery and implementation;
- b) Skills in data analysis, analytical thinking, data structure and demonstrated ability to work in an independent manner; and
- c) Effective working relationships with internal and external stakeholders, at all levels.

Specific academic and professional experience:

Students of project management, mathematics, data analysis, public administration, or economics preferred. Solid background in data analysis and writing projects related reports.

Language Skills:

Complete proficiency in English, including excellent drafting, presentation, and communication skills.

Other Skills:

Excellent analytical and numerical skills, proficiency in MS Office applications, particularly in MS Excel. Knowledge of maritime matters would be an advantage.
